

**YOU CAN ACCEPT THE ICAP IDENTIFICATION CARD WHEN LEGALLY  
ISSUED PICTURE IDENTIFICATION IS REQUIRED**

**THE ICAP ID HAS ALWAYS BEEN LEGAL.** In 2004 the ICAP identification card was given official approval by the South Carolina Sheriffs' Association. Effective February 15, 2007, the ICAP ID CARD DATABASE will be supported by the South Carolina Law Enforcement Division (SLED). The FUSION CENTER, a division of SLED, will be able to authenticate the validity of an ICAP ID card that has been presented for identification purposes. Local, county, state, or federal law enforcement agencies who have received an authorization code\* may access the ICAP ID database via the Fusion Center at SLED.

**CAUTION:** The ICAP ID card is NOT a government issued identification document. The ICAP ID is not sufficient for obtaining drivers' licenses, social security numbers, voter registration certificates, or any other kind of license or certification that may be issued which requires a *government issued document* for identification documentation. The ICAP identification card is not a right to work card. **THE ICAP ID CARD IS FOR IDENTIFICATION PURPOSES ONLY.**

**ABOUT THE ICAP ID CARD:** The ICAP ID card is issued according to South Carolina legal statutes found in the South Carolina Code of Laws. ICAP translates required documents and issues the ICAP ID in English. Procedures followed are in accordance with the legal statutes. There is a \$40.00 fee charged for the issuance of the ID. This fee is paid by the individual to whom the ID is issued. In addition to personal identification such as date of birth, height, weight, eye color, etc., the ID contains a full color picture, a thumb print, and the signature of the cardholder.

The ICAP ID is a laminated card. *The ICAP ID is not a stamped plastic card.* Because so many illegally issued cards are done in this stamped plastic format, ICAP followed the advice of law enforcement authorities in adopting our unique format. It is true that the laminate could possibly be removed and changes made to the card. However, these changes would be readily apparent. The special paper stock we use would show any attempts to alter the card. Also any attempt to photocopy the card will show hidden messages embedded in the paper warning that the copy is not authorized. Finally, a check against the information stored in the database will quickly reveal any altered information.

Forgeries of the ICAP identification card will instantly be revealed when the name and number are submitted to the database for a match. If the exact name-number match is not found in the database, the response to the query will be "Not Valid."

The laminated card format also allows us to individually notarize and apply a notary stamp onto *each and every* card issued. This stamp assures the portability of the card and, as well, makes a forgery more difficult.




Pictures of ICAP agents are featured on our website. No other persons are authorized to issue an ICAP identification card. **IF THE NAME AND PICTURE OF SOMEONE REPRESENTING HIMSELF OR HERSELF AS AN ICAP AGENT DOES NOT APPEAR ON THE WEBSITE, PLEASE INFORM YOUR LOCAL AUTHORITIES AT ONCE.**

**ABOUT THE DATABASE:** The database contains the same basic information that is printed on the ID card. In addition, emergency contact information is available in instances where the cardholder has provided this information.


